Sector 1: Water and Sanitation

General objective: to improve access to safe drinking water (production and distribution) and to allow for the development of economic activities in the country. The collection and transport of wastewater will also be addressed.

Specific objective:

- ✓ To improve conditions of access to water, hygiene and sanitation for the population and especially for the most vulnerable;
- ✓ Increasing the production and distribution of drinking water;
- ✓ Addressing wastewater treatment;
- ✓ Addressing solid waste management.

Expected results:

- Improving sustainable access to clean water for consumption, following the WHO standards in sufficient quantities and at affordable prices, especially in disadvantaged areas.
- Improving sustainable access to liquid and solid basic sanitation, hygiene respecting and preserving the environment.
- Improved water supply and sanitation services in a sustainable management through the use of modern technologies for the desalination of sea water and wastewater treatment.

Sector 2: Food Security

General objective: to promote food security through providing support to rural economic development in the interior regions. The EU projects aim to improve economic opportunities in areas supporting the creation of income-generating activities, and increasing the productivity of the primary sector. However, given the prevalence of global malnutrition (30%) at the national level, these efforts will combine food aid interventions and implementation of safety nets. Resilience to climate change will also form a front transverse action at EU projects in this sector.

Specific objectives:

- ✓ Increasing productivity in the primary sector
- ✓ Supporting the economic development of the interior regions
- ✓ Strengthening fight against malnutrition
- ✓ Fostering resilience to climate change

Expected results:

- The different age categories of the population have a healthy and diversified nutrition;
- The resilience of the most vulnerable to climate change has improved.

Civil Society

An indicative amount of up to 4 MEUR could be allocated to actions that will address the support of civil society.

To meet the needs of non-governmental organizations, allocations from the 11th EDF to support to civil society, will be aimed at strengthening governance at local, regional and national levels as well as improving citizens' control and advocacy capabilities of civil society in terms of social responsibility in the political and democratic spheres, as well as in the sectors of water and sanitation and food security. They will include:

- ✓ Promote a working environment for civil society organizations (CSOs) through the establishment of a regulatory framework specific to associations and adapted to the country,
- ✓ Strengthen the resources, human and material, public authorities in charge of relations with civil society;
- ✓ To increase the capacity of local CSOs to actively participate in the governance and development of the country.

Other support measures

It is envisaged the establishment of a Technical Cooperation Facility aimed to support the programming, preparation and implementation of actions. An indicative amount of up to 5 MEUR can be allocated for this support. A maximum indicative amount of 5 MEUR is provided to support the NAO.
