#### Sector 1: Health

**General objective:** To contribute to the improvement of health outcomes for all the population of Zimbabwe.

**Specific objectives:**

- To increase the protection of both women and men against health threats.
- To strengthen and further develop the national health system.
- To reduce inequalities including gender based in access to health services

**Expected results:**

- Increased access to maternal, neonatal and child health services including a comprehensive approach to sexual and reproductive health.
- Epidemic diseases timely detected and controlled and burden of Non Communicable diseases reduced.
- Increased population coverage related to preventable conditions/diseases.
- Reduced percentage of under five children wasted and/or stunted.
- Improved organization and management of services; Improved quality and availability of services provided by health facilities.
- Human resources for health numbers, skills and distribution optimized.
- Primary Health Care infrastructure including water/electricity/waste management is strengthened.

#### Sector 2: Agriculture

**General objective:** To contribute to creating a diversified, competitive and efficient agricultural sector that contributes to inclusive growth and revenue generation.

**Specific objective:**

- Improved policy framework to enable sustainable agricultural growth and natural resource management.

- Enhanced competitiveness of the agriculture sector through improved value chains (inputs, production, processing, marketing and trade) and an improved business/marketing environment taking advantage of opportunities arising from I-EPA implementation.
- Enhanced resilience, food security and reduced under-nutrition in children.

**Expected results:**

- Sector policies and risk analysis in the area of agriculture, natural resources, environment and climate change are reviewed, developed and/or mainstreamed.
- Strategic partnerships facilitated for increased investment in and financing of the agricultural sector.
- Increased capacity of farmers and improved access to inputs and services for the development of a productive and competitive agriculture sector.
- Increased competitiveness of agribusiness making use of opportunities arising from regional integration of the i-EPA (EU-ESA).
- Increased resilience and reduction in number of food insecure households through livelihoods interventions.

**Sector 3: Governance and institution building**

**General objective:** to strengthen public administrations to foster good governance, accountability and transparency in order to contribute to Zimbabwe's economic recovery and to the consolidation of the democratic process, as well as to peace and stability.

**Specific objective:**

- To support the implementation of public finance management reforms required to maintain macro-economic stability
- To support rule of law through judicial reforms and increased access to justice for all without discrimination.
- To contribute to the consolidation of the democratic process.
- To support the strengthening of the migration governance framework.

**Expected results:**

- Efficiency, transparency and equity in national resources allocations improved, through public finance management and public sector management reform processes.
- Increased judicial competence, integrity and professionalism.
- Enhanced capacity of all the population to exercise their access to justice; enhanced efficiency, transparency and efficiency of the justice system.
- Strengthened capacity and independence of the Parliament; electoral administration to conduct free and fair elections.
- Strengthened capacity and adoption of a coherent gender sensitive policy and legislative framework for a comprehensive approach to migration.

**Civil Society**

An indicative amount of 6 MEUR is set aside to support civil society organizations (CSO's). Support shall be provided to their participation in public policy formulation, transparency and accountability, service delivery, inclusive and sustainable growth and conflict prevention and peace building. Women organizations should play a key role in fostering women's rights.

**Other support measures**

A Technical cooperation facility is established to support the programming, preparation and implementation of the actions foreseen with a budget of 4 MEUR. An indicative amount of 3 MEUR is foreseen to support the National Authorizing Officer.
